SUPPLEMENTARY ORDER

19 November 1976


to the Order Prescribing Method of Regulating the Levels of Boundary Waters, dated 8 June 1949, as amended by Supplementary Orders dated 1 October 1957 and 29 July 1970.

The Commission was informed on 18 November 1976 by the Ontario-Minnesota Pulp and Paper Co., Ltd. that due to maintenance by Ontario Hydro on lines serving the company on 21 November 1976, additional flows of up to an instantaneous flow of 6300 cfs will be required for short periods of time on that day to maintain required plant operation. Such increased flows could result in an average flow for that day as high as 3600 cfs.

The effect of the increased flow on the level of Rainy Lake will be negligible.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS AND DIRECTS that, notwithstanding the terms of the Commission's Order dated 8 June 1949, as amended, the outflow from Rainy Lake for the day 21 November 1976 shall be regulated so that the maximum instantaneous discharge from Rainy Lake shall be no greater than 6300 cfs and the daily mean discharge shall be no greater than 3600 cfs. All other requirements of the above-noted Order, as amended, shall remain in force.
