My dear Mr. Stanley:

On April 1, 1946 you were requested to conduct an investigation into reported pollution of the St. Clair River, Lake St. Clair and the Detroit River and to submit a report containing your recommendations. Consultations with representatives of the United States and Canadian Governments have indicated that it is desirable to extend the scope of this investigation. Accordingly, the Governments of the United States and Canada have agreed to amend the first paragraph of the letter of reference dated April 1, 1946 to read as follows:

"The Governments of the United States and Canada having been informed that the waters of the St. Clair River, Lake St. Clair and the Detroit River and the waters of the St. Mary's River from Lake Superior to Lake Huron are being polluted by sewage and industrial wastes," etc.
